# STUDENT REPORTS

Term 1 Reports were issued on January 25. When reviewing these with children parents are reminded to focus on effort, behaviour, and attitude. Focusing on grades at this age does little for self-esteem and may distract from the bigger picture i.e. learning how to learn. Placing the emphasis on grades promotes short-term thinking and could foster negative behaviour and the wrong learning skills. It's more productive for parents to engage their child in a self-evaluation of their progress and achievements while offering as much support and guidance as possible.

During the formative years, Student Reports should be viewed mainly as an evaluation of the learning process. Reports are most useful when they help parents and children identify areas of strength and weakness; help students learn from mistakes; foster strategies for learning; and promote selfconfidence. They are NOT necessarily a valid measure of academic worth or intelligence.

If used exclusively as a measure of student ability, Reports can actually be detrimental to learning. Using marks to motivate students is *extrinsic motivation*, the old carrot-and-stick idea of external rewards, and discourages the development of creative and analytic skills. This is counterproductive to the kind of lifelong learning promoted by LDVA. The best kind of motivation for lifelong learning comes from within (intrinsic) and has three elements: **autonomy, mastery** and **purpose.** These are key elements of Montessori and LDVA's Da Vincian Principles. Placing the focus on learning rather than on marks helps to nurture children's intrinsic motivation and best prepares them for future learning.

In order to learn we must not be afraid of making mistakes. Teaching children that an honest mistake is nothing to be ashamed of but part of life experience is essential to developing confidence and the kind approach to life long learning promoted by LDVA. Since experience is the best teacher, children need to be encouraged to view mistakes or failure as a positive learning opportunity and to not be afraid to try as long as they are prepared to learn from it. The Da Vincian Principle of Dimostrazione, (a commitment to test knowledge through experience, persistence, and willingness to learn from mistakes) is a key element of the "Thinking Like Leonardo" approach to learning. # **RE-ENROLLMENT FORMS FOR 2019-2020**
